

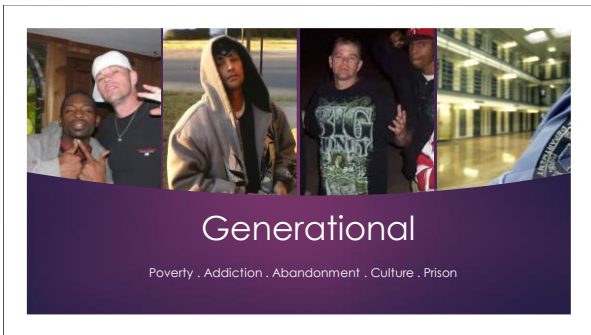


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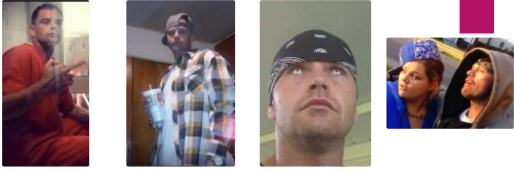
Learning Objectives

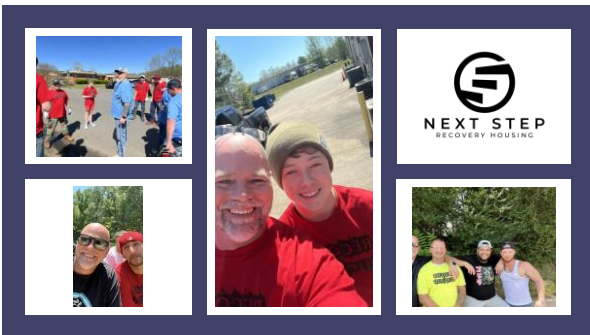
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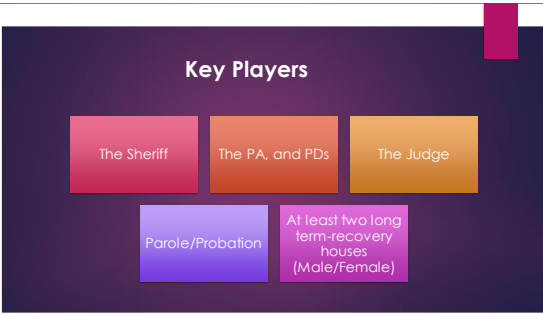
From the Dope house to the WhiteHouse



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The Program

- ▶ Length of program: One year
- ▶ SIS: 6 years
- ▶ Four months of inside recovery
- ▶ 10 months of long-term recovery housing



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Lonoke County Jail

- ▶ Lonoke County Jail released 16 men into society from the jail's recovery program.
- ▶ 12 have sustained recovery from Substance Use.
- ▶ 40% had been in a traditional treatment center more than once.
- ▶ 60% chose to go into recovery housing upon their release.
- ▶ 85% had been incarcerated at the same jail



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Our Jail Recovery Programs
are at a 74% Success Rate

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The Money

We have a total of 12 men who have not reoffended.
 The normal timeline for rearrests after release is 3 days to 6 weeks.
 We have saved the communities of Lonoke County a total of \$241,920 through the FACT Project.
 $\$56 \text{ per day} \times 12 = \672
 $\$672 \text{ per day} \times 30 \text{ (one month)} = \$20,160$
 $\$20,160 \text{ (one month)} \times 12 \text{ (one year)} = \$241,920$

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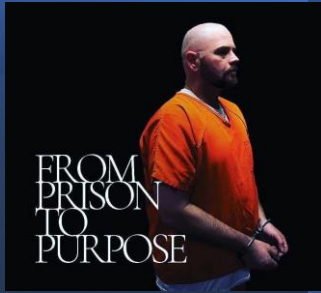
